PARENTS ARE PRIMAR

Continuing this month in our four month, series we look further into the 10 predictors of success at school with Mandi Moore. As she dives into the 10 things that parents can commit to in order to ensure they get the most value out of their children's Classical Christian education, she discusses three categories. This month we look at the points three of ten, under parents are primary.

PARÈNTS LIVE LIKE EDUCATION IS THE PARENT'S RESPONSIBILITY

1.Parents love God at home making Him Lord of their home

2. <u>Parents impress on their children</u> the importance of following <u>His commands</u>

Scripture commands parents to both love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength and to teach our children God's commandments so they may do the same. This mandate falls to parents, not to the government or educators.

The Latin phrase *in loco parentis* means that the school acts under the authority given by the parent. Even when parents delegate to LCA, they still own the education. They are still in touch, know what's happening and are part of it, and communicate often with the school.

> 3. Parents join the great conversation themselves.

In Classical Christian education we read about truth, goodness and beauty to shape our souls and our affections. As most of us didn't receive a classical education we join with our students as they learn so we become a part of the conversation.
